Background

- The process commenced in 2011 with Destination 2036
- Subject of Local Govt Review Panel report Council made numerous submissions to the process
- An assessment was undertaken of all Councils by TCorp
- Fit For the Future (FFF) announced in Sept 2014
- Rural Council Model developed end of Feb 2015
- Submission required 30 June 2015
- Panel to make a determination on the submission

In April 2014 the Independent Local Government Review Panel proposed the following options for the Coolamon Shire Council - a Local Board in Riverina County Council or **merge with Temora and/or Junee**.

In the final report (October 2014) the Panel's proposed options for the Coolamon Shire Council were - a Rural Council in Riverina Joint Organisation (JO) or merge with Bland and/or Temora.

For this reason Junee's results and financial information has been included in this presentation for comparison.

Recommendations for Coolamon Shire

Initially

- Become a 'Rural Council' in Riverina Joint Organisation (JO)
- Merge with Bland and/or Temora
- Regardless Council must prove that it has Scale and Capacity

Currently

• Also has the option of 'A Council Improvement' Proposal



What is a Joint Organisation (JO)

- A collection of Councils that come together to work collaboratively
- We currently are a member of REROC (Riverina Eastern Regional Organisation of Councils) Have been since its inception as Treasurer.

Council believes this body performs the role of a JO and are currently in negotiation with all other member Councils and the State Government to pilot a model that sees this Organisation continue to perform this role

• Coolamon Shire Council see this as how we gain Scale and Capacity



What has Council Done

- Had to make decisions to allow operations to continue whilst information was being 'rolled out' (eg budgets, work schedules, etc)
- Based on two key points
- Will the Coolamon Shire and its Communities be better off
- Will the Coolamon Shire Communities Maintain Local Governance

Founded on the principle that

Strong Rural Communities make Strong Regional Centres

NOT

Strong Regional Centres surrounded by dying rural communitie

What Did This Mean

- As a result of these assumptions Coolamon Shire Council has moved forward with preparing a 'Council Improvement' submission.
- Council has employed a Trainee Asset Manager
- Changes made to budget around capital and operational definition
- Council's 10 year strategic Budgets are realistically forecasted (still conservative. We have not compromised our standards)










Q1 Are you a resident of Coolamon Shire? (Tick preference)







Q6 Do you think that Coolamon Shire merging with a Neighbouring shire would improve the delivery of services to your community? (Tick preference)





Q7 Would you prefer to merge with a Neighbouring Council(s)? (Tick preference)





Q8 Would you prefer to remain independent as the Coolamon Shire? (Tick preference)









- c) Become a Rural Council.

In addition to this Council will be visiting Ganmain on Wednesday 22nd April at 7pm to talk to the Matong and Ganmain communities at the Ganmain Hall. Similarly a meeting will be held at the Coolamon Sports Club on Wednesday 29th April at 7pm to discuss these issues.

GRANT APPLICATION FOR HERITAGE WORKS - 2015/2016

Council in conjunction with the NSW Heritage Office has allocated funding towards grants associated with heritage conservation. This funding is directed towards assistance with minor works that will enhance or identify local heritage items. Proposed works must be completed in the financial year that the money is allocated.

The allocation of these grants will be on a dollar for dollar basis with priority being given, but not limited to heritage items. Application forms are now available at the Coolamon Shire Council, 55 Cowabbie Street Coolamon or can be downloaded from the website <u>www.coolamon.nsw.gov.au</u>. Closing date for submissions is **Wednesday 27th May 2015.** The successful applicants will be notified after the June Council meeting.

Grant funding is limited and therefore very competitive. Ensure that your application is correctly completed and submitted on time to give yourself the best possible opportunity of being successful.

HOUSEHOLD HAZARDOUS WASTE COLLECTION

Council and REROC are once again providing a Household Hazardous Waste Collection at the Coolamon Shire Council Depot (located behind the Shire offices) between 8am and 11am on Tuesday 23rd June.

The Collection provides home owners with an opportunity to safely dispose of hazardous wastes that Council cannot generally accept at its Landfill sites, including paints, pesticides, herbicides and other toxic substances.

The program is free for the first 20kg. Commercial rates may apply thereafter.

DELIVERY PROGRAM AND OPERATIONAL PLAN

Council at its April meeting resolved to place the Draft Delivery Program 2015/2019 and Draft Operational Plan 2015/2016 on public exhibition.

The Delivery Program sets the direction of Council for the next four years so that the community's needs and expectations are met in a planned, co-ordinated and cost effective manner. It includes a list of the actions and activities that are proposed to be undertaken by Council over the four year period, the proposed rating structure for the 2015/2016 year, a list of fees and charges for the 2015/2016 year and detailed estimates of income and expenditure for the four years.

Submissions may be made to Council at any time during the period of public exhibition.

LOCAL GOVERNMENT REFORM FIT FOR THE FUTURE

FIT FOR THE FUTURE

The State Government has produced a document titled "Fit for the Future", a blueprint for the Future of Local Government. This document is in response to the Review of Local Government undertaken by the Independent Review Panel.

Whilst Council agrees with the principle of Local Government being robust and capable to serve its communities, there are some issues raised by this report that are concerning to our Shire.

This document gives the magic population figure as 10,000 people for a Council to be fit for purpose. Whilst there are also other performance indicators that are relevant to services provided, infrastructure provision and financial security, it appears irrelevant how many people are within a Shire boundary if the other performance indicators can be met.

Whilst the State Government maintains that this process is not about forced amalgamations, there is an underlying tone that population is a factor in a Council's ability to serve its communities.

ATTENTION DOG OWNERS

During the past few months Council has seen a large increase in the amount of complaints for wandering dogs. Dog owners are required by law (under the Companion Animals Act 1998) to ensure their dogs remain in their yards at all times, except for when secured by a leash under the control of a competent person.

When dogs wander, the likelihood of them becoming a nuisance or attacking people and other animals also increases significantly, as does the chance of the dogs being declared as either menacing or dangerous. Fines for wandering dogs vary from \$220 to \$1760.

Council is therefore asking that dog owners take all reasonable steps to ensure that dogs are kept in a secure yard. A simple check of your fences and gates can save not only your wallet, but also your pet.

FIREBREAKS POLICY

Council shall require the owner or occupier of any land within the Shire exceeding four hectares in area to make and maintain fire breaks surrounding the entire property or as

near as practicable thereto by ploughing or maintaining bare earth to a width of not less than **3 metres**, such work must be completed by the 31 October, and where land is under crop by the 30 November. Where harvesting is carried out prior to the 30 November, fire



breaks must be established prior to such harvest.

Where it is intended to carry out clover harvesting and the clover paddock to be harvested is located on the boundary of a property, landholders are required to establish a fire break by ploughing to a width of not less than 10 metres (33ft) along such boundary.
