The process from here?

- 4 April Public exhibition closes
- April Comments considered, draft finalised
- 26 April Council adopts Community Strategic Plan
- 30 April Plan sent to Division of Local Government



The other planning documents



- Resource Strategy
 - Workforce Plan to Council 22.3.12
 - Long Term Financial Plan - commenced
 - Asset Management Plans etc – completed except for Recreational Assets and Transport Asset Plans being updated
- Four Year Delivery Program – draft complete except for budget
- Annual Operational Plan - commenced
- All documents adopted by Council by 28 June

The Community Strategic Plan

- State Government requirement
- Must be a **community** document – NOT A COUNCIL DOCUMENT
- Minimum 10 year focus
- Consider state and regional plans
- Outline how progress in implementation will be measured and reported
- Provide for the council to regularly report to the community on progress.

The Engagement Process

- Social Plan 2011-2016
 - 2010 Visited all villages, 2 Cobar meetings and more – starting point
- 2011
 - 430+ people participated
 - Council staff, community, CBA and Tourism groups, View Club, CWP, Rural Roads, Govt depts, Interagencies, Youth, mines, Euabalong Progress, Murrin Bridge, Nymagee

Important Things to Remember

- Annual budget \$28m
- Workforce limitations
- Level of service provision desired
- Basic functions that must be maintained
- Asset management planning
- Council's roles and responsibilities



Community Values

- A community that is generous, engaged and participative and that welcomes new residents and encourages them to stay.
- Vibrant and valued industries with a strong social consciousness that participate in the community.



Community Values

- A well funded and well governed Council that is engaged with the community and encourages their participation in decision making.
- Access to quality and well maintained infrastructure.

Key Challenges

- Need for good infrastructure provision and access to services while considering the key constraint – lack of financial resources

Key Challenges

- Community services and facilities to assist residents and encourage new residents to Shire
- Assist community groups
- Grow and strengthen key business sectors
- Increase funding for events, services and infrastructure provision

Strategies

- 65 Strategies across the 5 areas
- Responsibility given to governments, community, council or business
- Organisation given support responsibility
- Timing – generally ongoing

Delivery Program

- Council document outlining what we're going to do over the Councillor term.
- Updated in Sept
- Gives the actions we'll undertake to achieve the strategies in CSP
- Annual operating plan then developed with action activities to be undertaken each year

Delivery Program

- 43 actions in community
- 19 actions in economic
- 43 governance actions
- 22 infrastructure actions
- 11 environment actions
- Report 6 monthly to council on progress

Reporting

- Quarterly report to Council on operating plan
- Six monthly report to Council on Delivery Program
- Annual Report on Delivery Program and Annual Operating Plan.
- End of term report on Delivery Program
- Performance indicators in Delivery Program
