Liverpool City Council Fit For the Future Survey

The State Government wants to reduce the number of metropolitan councils from 42 to as little as 15. This is to be achieved by merging local and bordering councils together.

The argument for mergers is that a bigger council could achieve economic efficiencies and an argument against is that a larger council servicing a population of around 450,000 may be less responsive to community needs or local issues.
