1 Opal fares increase by 3% on average

Transport for NSW has notified IPART that it proposes to increase Opal fares by an average of 3% from 4 July 2022.

Most fares will increase by around 3.6%

There will be no change to:

- the O-3km fare for peak travel on buses and light rail (and the Stockton Ferry in Newcastle)
- the \$2.50 daily cap for Opal Gold
- the \$50 weekly cap
- travel rewards and transfer discounts.

Opal fares are fares for train, bus, ferry, light rail and metro services on which an Opal card can be used. These services operate in Sydney, Newcastle, the Central Coast, Wollongong, the Blue Mountains and Hunter regions.

2 New Opal fares comply with IPART determination

IPART has considered the planned changes and found that they do not exceed the maximum fares in Schedule 1 of the current Opal fare determination.

Under the changes, the peak 0-3 kilometre fare for bus, light rail and Stockton Ferry services will be equal to the maximum value. All other fares remain below the maximum.
