Summary

This report seeks Council support for additional allocation from concerns raised by Clrs Tucker & McCarthy following a recent joint onsite meeting held on 28 March 2022 in relation to the proposed construction of new kerb & gutter to rectify stormwater drainage at the eastern end of Dart Street from the intersection of Earl Street through to the open space drainage catchment area.

05.03 2022-23 ADDITIONAL RATE SPECIAL VARIATION

Summary

This report seeks a Council resolution to endorse the application for an Additional Special Variation (ASV).

Council has worked on two versions of the Draft 2022-23 Operational Plan due to the uncertainty between using a 0.7% Rate Peg or a 2.1% Rate Uplift to be decided being presented. Both show a forecast of \$33 million income, with a Negative Change in Councils Working Capital of \$1.8 million and \$1.7 million respectively. If we removed the proposed Land Development Costs from both of these scenarios the result would be positive \$4,673 and \$66,225 respectively.

 - a. the additional income that Council will receive if approved compared to that Rate Peg of 0.7% as determined by IPART in December 2021 totals \$68,000.00;
 - b. the additional income is required to maintain Councils current levels of services and operations to the Oberon LGA;
 - c. that Council has considered the impact on ratepayers and the community in 2022/23 Operational Plan and future years and that the impact is reasonable.

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7. GENERAL BUSINESS

Clr Graham – issue of driveway 39 Oberon Street, mentioned in minutes of last Works Committee, there was no resolution at that meeting.

Chris – owners were written to outlining councils' obligation and Transport for NSW had no objection as it was councils jurisdiction. There are utilities int eh footpath and modifications required for the rock wall that would be required to be understood as part of the design process. There has not been a quote provided to the owners. We do not have an objection, however it would be at their full cost should they decide to pursue it.

Clr McCarthy – indicated that she has not received correspondence from Council advising that they are able to have other contractors carry out the works. Clr McCarthy asked if bridge gutters are appropriate in the design.

Chris – they are not really appropriate in this day. They would need to put their suggestion back to council for endorsement.

House in dart street next to Mitre 10, with the new footpath installed they cannot get in and out of their driveway properly.

Chris can inspect – Clr Graham to provide more details.

Tucker – pg 10 minutes of last meeting. Dreeves Road, know there has been work done a couple of decades ago. Request an update – Mr & Mrs Byrom.

Gary – we have responded to the parties in relation to the matter and council is of the opinion that the matter can be resolved easily, now in their hands to see which way they want to go. Right of carriage way is the outstanding matter.

Clive – the right of carriageway is their own problem. The crown road is our problem as it doesn't link to the other crown road. You won't get approval without the link.

Clr McCarthy – like council to install conduits on Oberon Road. Two sites that have to go across the road. The RMS just turn up and hot mix, that's the last section to do hotmixing. We have the design, I would like to see them put in.

The WC at the Reef needs steam cleaning, its full of bird shit. Its not a job that the council workers can do as part of their routine cleaning program. It needs tidying up.

Like to see council consider Mozart road, look at culverts where the fish river and long arm come in. we might straighten that road up. Look around things.

Where are we up to with the mack truck that had the incident on Sewells Creek Road.

Chris – it should be back in service in the next month – currently in Dubbo.

Clive – Abercrombie Road – need to make application for the road reserve. Cnr Abercrombie Road and Campbells River Road.

Gary – we already have delegation to proceed. No party previously came forward with the requirements council had set. We had previously commenced the process, but did not proceed.

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We don't own the land that we are calling for expressions of interest for.

Yes we do, need to close it formally and undertake the transfer. If council wish to proceed with the closure and purchase.

Clive - happy to support that.

Only thing, landholder has been very supportive of us straightening roads at Edith, we got a report that the RMS have a new policy that they do not sell the road reserves.

Chris – once the acquire land they do not like to sell it back.

Clive – they have been supportive of us straightening the road up and RMS informed us that they would not sell the land back.

Gary – don't see that as being the case, we will pursue.

Hayden – people are attracted to Oberon due to its roads, it doesn't need the roads straightened up everywhere, they like the windy roads to travel. We need to take into consideration we are a sacred meeting place for indigenous cultures. We need to take cultural into consideration that we get the right indigenous and cultural reports done before we carry out any works. Are we doing that currently?

Chris – we do due diligence in terms of environmental consultation. Within a road reserve, unless we need a road realignment, within the current road realignment.

Hayden – there has been a lot of destruction that has occurred and the onus is on us to protect heritage.

Clive – we do environmental impact statements on works that are required. They need to be factual. I was told there was yellow box trees in Oberon, to my knowledge it cuts off at xxx hill. The chips that are significant where the quarry was, Clr McMahon said that chip is all over this property. That significant chip was insignificant. Recently where there was a smash at Lapstone hill. Typical example, aboriginal significant. Bloke from Victoria claimed I sprayed that wall when I was 18 years old with my brother. Our heritage is significant but we need to deal with facts.
