Water must be bought in via truck at a current cost of \$290.00 a load (10,000 litres), to get this water, there is often a 3 week wait. The last thing that the people in the small villages of the upper Hunter need is a rate increase that serves them no benefit. By no benefit I mean not a single cent spent in Blandford, Wingen and Parkville. We need water infrastructure badly, this has not been budgeted for, nor considered, even in the ongoing development of the Scone to Murrurundi pipeline. It is my opinion that the improvements that this special rate rise is to pay for, are unnecessary, and, when compared to the needs of so many others that are expected to foot the bill for this, irresponsible.
