Thousands of Port Stephens residents signed online and paper petitions objecting to this ridicules proposal. Many people made their voices heard & Council ignored every single objection.

The majority of residents and Local Businesses are against the proposal.

Awareness in the area about Council developments and plans are poor. This lack of awareness has been fuelled by Council changing amounts of money being allocated to projects, between when this proposal first went out to public submission and what has been submitted to IPART.
