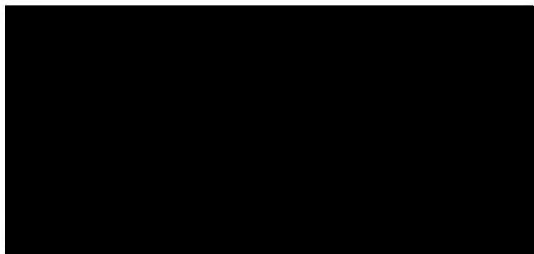
Make an Objection to the Independent Pricing & Regulatory Tribunal (IPART)

The proposed rate increase is now an application before the Independent Pricing and regulatory Tribunal. It would be of assistance for you to make an objection to the Tribunal asking for them to reject Shoalhaven Council's application in favour of telling Council to adopt a long term strategy.
