Submission:

I oppose any rate rise which is higher than the rate peg of 3.4% set by IPART with my objections being;

- The 3.4% is above the rate of inflation and therefore, considered adequate to cope with the rising costs in managing our community.
- 1. Replacement of aging infrastructure should be covered by budgeted depreciation over the life of the infrastructure and not paid for by current rate payers.
- 2. New infrastructure and services should be provided on the basis of affordability, Government grants and fund raising.

I have to live within my means and I elect councillors on that basis, to manage council business with the available finances, which already includes a 3.4% increase for this year.

The 6.9% submission by council was not part of the recent community consultation and most certainly would have been rejected if it had.
