Dear IPART. I have been informally monitoring the NSW Biodiversity Market and others in Australia since about 2013. Most recently, I was well on the way to building a complete Australia-wide species, threats, ecosystems, risks and development database. It is actually called my Space-Time-Systems Economics Quantum Entanglement database for every species, ecosystem, development (public and private), weed, imported pest/risk, cost and price available Australia-wide. The illegal trading in illegal plants, animals, fungi, virus's, algae, medicines, pests, pets, and bio-weapons should indicate how skewed biodiversity offset prices were, are & will be; now add the price of future pandemics carried by our fruit bats, feral animals, endangered fish/ell, whales, birds, rodents, marsupials. 4.
