Greater rewards for Sydney Water customers who conserve water I feel we should follow the example of Sydney Water for the Central Coast Water increase pricing for 2022. Sydney Water. A typical Sydney Water households bill will fall by \$80 or 7% from 1 July, as a result of decisions released today by the Independent Pricing and Regulatory Tribunal (IPART). From 1 July 2020 the price you pay for water will depend on dam levels. While dam levels are above 60%, you will pay \$2.35 per kilolitre of water you consume. But if dam levels fall below 60%, this price will rise to \$3.18 per kilolitre. This decision reflects the increased costs of supplying water in periods of scarcity, and provides a stronger reward to households who conserve water in drought. The drought price provides stronger incentives for customers to conserve water when it is most scarce, without locking in higher prices when dams are full.
