Dear Sirs,

I refer to the fact that Warringah Council is seeking to apply future Rates increases which exceed level normally allowed, justifying the application by way of indicating enhanced levels of service.

I submit to you that Warringah Council is improvident, already having a significant level of financial waste, aggravated by lack of efficiency, to which I feel entitled to object, thus I further submit that the application should not be approved.

On a more personal note, my Wife and myself are self-funded retirees with only modest incomes from pension funds which are only a little outside the assets test. As such we do not feel able to face any kind of cost increase beyond what is imposed by inflation. We also happen to live in an "outlying" suburb which seems unlikely to benefit from what Warringah Council has proposed. In making these points, it is appreciated that these are isolated issues.
