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Submission: I consider the increases (38.9%) to be an unfair impost on the farming sector which currently contributes 40% of total rates revenue in Gunnedah Shire. Council points out this will drop to 38.2% but it is still by far the greatest contributor. The proposed increases come after a succession of poor seasons and drought when farmers are endeavouring to make some sort of financial recovery. The farming contribution is is in stark contrast to the mining sector (currently 8.64% rising to 13.6%) which is fast becoming the economic lifeblood of the town and district. I view several of council's projects including parklands development, town hall upgrades, and the Blackjack Creek flood management plan for a 1 in 100 yr event as non core expenditure. I believe no rate increases should be implemented before the council has undertaken an expenditure review program. Sound management dictates that one does undertake home renovations in times of financial stress. A modest increase would be tolerated but I believe on the scale proposed (which appears to be fulfilling a wishlist) will drive many in the rural sector to their knees. It also comes at a time when council management is under question. A vital submission to the state government which would have seen Resources for Regions funding come to Gunnedah was never made. Why should such a body be charged with more funds when this sort of ineptitude is clearly on display? Commissioners I urge caution if Gunnedah is to continue as a viable rural centre.
