Following years of water access reform resulting in the consumptive pool of water being reduced and the environmental water pool or the general publics water increasing I find it extraordinary that irrigators are being forced to pay the environmental expenses .

I have no problem with paying the costs associated with the consumptive water but can not accept the proposal that consumptive water users pay 80% of fish ladders when the reality is a weir has a lot more than 20% of environmental water in the total volume in a year , the cost should be prorated on this basis.

With climate change making longer dry periods and possibly short sharp wet phases it is imperative that we get value from our water storage and distribution company , Going on the cost increases proposed , we are far from satisfied in their performance .
