IPART sets the maximum prices for CCC Water

- IPART sets the maximum prices the Central Coast Council (the council) can charge its customers for the water, wastewater and other services provided by it as a Water Supply Authority.
- IPART also sets the maximum percentage by which the council may increase its general income each year through the local government rate peg or special variations.
- To avoid confusion, we refer to:
 - the council's functions as a Water Supply Authority under the Water Management Act 2000 as 'CCC Water'
 - the council's local government functions under the Local Government Act 1993 as 'the council'









Short-term focus

CCC Water should prepare and publish an annual performance report, setting out its performance against measures that reflect the community's preferences

At the public hearing, we will consult with customers to help CCC Water develop performance measures that align with the community's preferences

Medium to long-term focus

Performance review

IPART intends to recommend the Minister gives us a referral to investigate and report publicly on CCC Water's performance and progress in 2 years




Benefit from other inquiries
