NSW Coastal Conference Showcases Beauty of Kiama Kiama Municipal Council proudly

Kiama Municipal Council proudly hosted the 21st NSW Coastal Conference at The Pavilion Kiama in November, placing the region centre stage with leaders in the field of coastal management and protection.

The NSW Coastal Conference is one of the most prestigious meetings on coastal management and protection issues in NSW. Over 200 delegates from across the state had the opportunity to hear 45 papers presented on a wide range of topics, including 'the need for a multidisciplinary approach to coastal management' and 'innovative approaches to engage the community in preserving the coastline'.

The Kiama Municipality's coastline is a shared resource for the local community. Best practices to preserve and protect the natural environment are a priority for Council who will be working in partnership with local environmental and community groups.

"With evidence confirming climate change and rising sea levels, it is critical

Kiama Council is a founding member of the Taskforce which aims to provide support and guidance to coastal councils attempting to manage the impact of rapid growth.



that coastal councils like ours are aware of, and equipped to act upon, the latest research findings and priorities to best manage these immense issues," commented Councillor Brian Petschler, Mayor of Kiama.

Kiama Council has completed a number of innovative environmental projects in recent times including the Kiama Coastal Walk, Riverside Drive Minnamurra Riverbank Stabilisation work and the award-winning Hindmarsh Park Stormwater Quality Treatment and Re-use project.

Conference delegates had the opportunity to view these projects first-hand as part of a series of tours hosted by Council staff.

Council Elections

The new Council is settling in well, having already held several monthly meetings. We have also had a number of briefings from the staff on the wide range of activities that Council controls and manages, particularly on planning matters and on the rolling 10 year Community Strategic Plan and budget currently being developed for the 2013/14 financial year.

I congratulate Councillor Warren Steel, our new Deputy Mayor, and Councillor Neil Reilly, who join me as returning Councillors and welcome our new Councillors - Gavin McClure, Dennis Seage, Andrew Sloan, Kathy Rice, Mark Way and Mark Honey. I am confident that we will work closely and co-operatively for the benefit of our area.

At the elections we said goodbye to our former Mayor, Sandra McCarthy, when she decided to stand down. Sandra had an outstanding 12 year term as Mayor, setting a new record in that office, as well as some time as Deputy Mayor during her 17 years as a Councillor. Sandra can be proud of her legacy, leaving a Council that has a sound financial base, finalising a new and major planning structure for the Kiama Municipality. She played a significant role in the success of the NBN program and driving the development of the Kiama Health Plan, both of which have received much international interest. Sandra also led the Southern Councils Group during a difficult period for our regional group of Councils. Council will be formally recognising our former Mayor's service with the NSW Local Government Association early in the New Year.

At the September elections we also said farewell to former Councillors Lexie Wheeler, Monique Dare-Ward, Ben van der Wijngaart, Trevor Fredericks and Peter Bowman, all of whom did not stand for re-election. We thank them for their service and wish them well in the future.



Council's 2013/14 Budget

Council staff are already working on the proposals to be considered for the Works Program in next year's budget. When completed, that will be integrated in the Community Strategic Plan and the Operational Plan for the year.

The process involves a major period of community review, with the plans and programs proposed for 2013/14 placed on public exhibition before they can be adopted by Council.

Submissions on the Plans are invited and I would encourage interested parties to inspect the documents when they are placed on exhibition and to make representations where appropriate.

The draft budget documents and the revised Community Strategic Plan are due to be available in April/May 2013 and will be advertised when prepared. The full documents will be available on the Council's website, at the Council office and at the Library branches.

Season's Greetings

Since becoming Mayor, I have been deeply impressed by the number of residents who volunteer their time and skills to contribute to the community service groups active in our area. I have seen the work done by the combined charities in their Christmas Card Shop in the old Council Chambers, with ladies from the Red Cross, the Children's Medical Research Committee, along with a number of other charitable groups, volunteering to sell the cards to raise funds for those they assist. I recently received a wonderful assortment of wooden toys from the men of the Kiama Men's Shed - all lovingly carved, constructed and painted, for the Mayor's Giving Tree. These toys will gladden the hearts of children at Christmas, who might otherwise miss out.

There are so many volunteers in a range of other groups, all working to assist their fellow residents to help make our municipality a great place in which to live.

Kiama Municipal Council makes history **delivering services online**

Kiama Council became the first council in Australia to deliver its services online using state-of-the-art videoconferencing and the National Broadband Network (NBN).

The live video conference was held at the North Kiama Neighbourhood Centre (in the NBN first release site of Kiama Downs) in October 2012, and connected with remote users at the Kiama Library, home users in the Kiama area and officials from Federal Government offices in Canberra. This technology allowed all participants to actively engage in discussions and interact with other users in 'real time'.

Kiama's Digital Local Government Program 'Kiama Connect' enables Kiama Council to deliver workshops, community engagement sessions and other Council services, via the NBN, to any laptop, computer, iPad or smartphone.

The outcome of this project will enable residents, or anyone online, to engage with Council digitally.

The NBN is transforming the way Kiama Council engages with its residents, facilitating communication with those groups who have traditionally been hard to reach – such as young people, frail or elderly, people with a disability, at-home parents and workers who commute out of the area.

"Kiama Council and its residents will benefit both now, and for generations to come, because of this program. It



opens the doors for communication with residents and creates a strong digital community which mirrors the strong community spirit Kiama is so well known for," said Councillor Brian Petschler, Mayor of Kiama.

Funding for the program has been provided by the Department of Broadband, Communications and the Digital Economy, under the Digital Local Government Program.

Free one-on-one computer training

Kiama Library's Information Technology Librarian offers free one-on-one sessions to help guide you through computer questions and queries. The session can cover topics including how to use Skype, setting up email addresses and using a laptop for the first time.

GO Organics trial maximises NBN technology

Kiama Council utilised videoconferencing to inform and engage residents as part of its series of community engagement meetings to launch the 'GO Organics – Kitchen to Compost Revolution' Program Trial.

Go Organics is an exciting and innovative household waste collection system currently being trialled by residents on the western side of Riverside Drive. It allows food scraps to be put into the green waste bin for composting by Council, in an effort to



reduce the amount of waste to landfill.

The videoconferencing link technology enabled remote participation from residents unable to physically attend the meetings taking place at the North Kiama Neighbourhood Centre. Remote users were able to engage as if they were actually there in person – they could see presentations from Council staff, view video footage, hear questions from other residents and ask their own questions.



Review of Special Rate Variation

Following extensive community consultation in 2009 and early 2010 Kiama Municipal Council made applications to increase its general income for each of the next four (4) years by 6.5%.

Due to the pending Integrated Planning process each council was required to undertake, the Minister provided a limited approval for Council to increase its rates by 6.5% for the 2009/2010 and 2010/2011 financial years, with the variations expiring in 2013/2014 and 2014/2015.

It was expected that Council would apply for the additional two (2) years of 6.5% rate rises following the completion of the Integrated Planning process involving the preparation of a



Community Strategic Plan and long-term financial plan.

Following the implementation of a number of efficiencies by Council and the availability of low interest loans for infrastructure improvements by the new NSW Government, Council has recently resolved to not proceed with the additional two (2) years of 6.5% rate increases while seeking to retain the rate base provided by the 2009/2010 and 2010/2011 rate increases.

It would mean that Council would commence the 2013/2014 financial year with the existing rating base and apply the recently approved Independent Pricing and Regulatory Tribunal (IPART) rate peg increase of 3.4% which applies to all NSW local councils.

Happy holidays with **weekly** recycling service



Kiama Council will be providing additional weekly recycling services throughout December 2012 and January 2013 in recognition of the increase in packaging and recyclable materials generated over the holiday season.

Since its inception back in 2010, Council has seen a significant increase in the amount of recyclable material collected from the additional weekly recycling services. As a result, weekly recycling is now a regular service provided during the December and January holiday period. There will be four extra recycling services provided per zone between 1 December 2012 and 31 January 2013.

These services have been included in the waste and recycling calendars distributed to all households in July. Join the **Fridge Buyback Brigade!**



Fridge Buyback is an awardwinning residential energy savings program that actually pays you to help save the environment and reduce your power bills by giving up your old second fridge or upright freezer.

Old fridges are one of the biggest energy users in the home, consuming up to three times the energy of new fridges. Running a typical second fridge adds an average of \$300 a year to your power bill and puts one tonne of carbon pollution into the environment. And, old upright freezers use almost as much power as an old fridge.

Fridge Buyback provides regular collection runs to the Kiama Municipality. Fridge Buyback provides residents with free collections by professional removalists and a \$35 rebate if the removal of the appliance involves 6 steps or less. Fridge Buyback operates under the NSW Government's Energy Savings Scheme and is supported by Kiama Council.

Who let the dogs out?

Dog ownership is an integral part of family life and Kiama Council offers its residents and visitors eight coastal locations for the off-leash exercise and recreation of dogs, whilst under the control of their owners or handlers.

Bombo Beach is a particularly popular spot during summer, which can be used for off-leash activities from sunrise to sunset. Dog owners are reminded to follow the Conditions of Use for this area, in particular:

- Dogs are only permitted to enter or exit Bombo Beach off-leash area via the shortest practical route from the fenced walkway that passes under the railway bridge from Hothersal Street car park at the southern end
- Dogs are only permitted off-leash and to swim in the centre area of Bombo Beach as indicated by southern and northern limit signs erected on the beach. Kiama Council's Ranger Service

promotes the responsible use of off-leash areas and infringements will be issued for offences. These include dogs in a prohibited place (\$330), dogs off-leash in a public place (\$220) and failure to remove dog faeces (\$275). Local residents and visitors must adhere to the Off-leash areas Conditions of Use, for the benefit of the whole community.

The following major projects are proposed from December 2012 to February 2013:

- ✓ Completion of the Black Beach Amenities Block
- ✓ Completion of the Blackwood Street, Gerringong footpath and Local Area Traffic Management works. This involves construction of footpaths on the northern and southern side of Blackwood Street, from Fern Street to the shopping area, construction of a pedestrian crossing point, road line marking and parking signage
- ✓ Road resurfacing work on Clover Hill Road, Minnamurra Lane, Young Street, Allowrie Street and Churchill Street
- ✓ Continuation of Streetscape improvement work in Terralong Street. This involves replacing sections of old existing concrete and paved areas with new pavers
- ✓ Continuation of the construction of a footpath in Belinda Street, Gerringong, between Noble Street and Tasman Drive.
