# **INTRODUCTION**

Since July 2009 Kiama Council has undertaken a process of consultation with the local community in order to gather information for the development of a 10 year Community Strategic Plan. This period of consultation should be viewed in the context of the ongoing engagement process that Council seeks to have with the community and the information will build on what has been learnt from previous consultation activities.

Council has had a strong and active commitment to community engagement and consultation dating back to 1986/87 when the decision was made to implement a social planning process in order to develop Council's first Social Plan. Extensive consultation was undertaken and the process was overseen by the Social Planning Development Group, comprised of elected representatives, staff representatives and community members.

This tradition continues under the umbrella of new legislation introduced in 2009 relating to Integrated Planning and Reporting for local governments. A number of consultations and engagement strategies were undertaken in the second half of 2009, these being:

Following in this report are some preliminary results from the first three of these consultation processes. Information from the Health Plan review and the Economic Development Committee will be included in later updates and will contribute to informing the Community Strategic Plan.

The information that has been gathered relates to all facets of living and lifestyle in the Kiama LGA. However, some areas of concern to residents are not the direct responsibility of Council, but relate more closely to other State or Commonwealth Departments, such as Health and Transport. These issues will still be incorporated into the Community Strategic Plan, as the plan seeks to identify and plan for the needs and aspirations of the community as a whole. The role of Council in these issues may be as an advocate of community need and a facilitator of negotiations between all stakeholders.

# Community Survey

The Community Survey was distributed as both a hard copy and online questionnaire, with a long and short version also available. Promotion of the survey was undertaken through:

- Community notices in local newspapers
- Article in The Independent
- Email distribution lists, community directory, schools, churches, business groups, cultural groups etc
- Article and short version survey in Kimunico
- Short version survey letter box drop
- Long version hardcopy distribution and drop off points at; Gerringong and Kiama Libraries,
   Council Customer Service, Kiama Leisure Centre, North Kiama Neighbourhood Centre and
   three Jamberoo businesses
- Long version hardcopy surveys and flyers distributed to local pre-schools.
- Word of mouth and distribution to networks by Council Officers


A total of five hundred and sixty three (563) completed surveys were returned. Of the long form survey; ninety three (93) were hardcopy and three hundred and twenty (320) were completed online. Of the short form survey all one hundred and fifty (150) completed surveys were hardcopy.

The total number of surveys returned represents a very high response rate within the population of the LGA (population approx 18,540 - 2006 Census) and is a statistically significant sample. The response rate for the 12-19 year olds was low; however, this was compensated for by the information obtained through the youth survey conducted with the support of Kiama High School. It is, however, acknowledged that the age group 20-30 yrs is under-represented in the results, despite the varied formats and options that were made available to complete the survey. Council will therefore continue to explore opportunities and methods of engagement that will obtain the views and ideas of this age group.




# Age Breakdown







# **Rating of Council's Maintenance of Facilities**






What community Facilities Do you use regularly (more than once a month?)





How do rate Council's maintenance of the facilities?





How important is it to you that Council provides these services in the future?






# Do you find sustainability and carbon reduction schemes confusing?









# Youth Survey





### Advocate Interviews

For this consultation process a cross-section of community advocates were identified from within your local community. These people were interviewed individually and spoke with passion about the issues and needs within the community.


The interview process was time and human resource intensive and therefore the number of people able to be involved was limited to fourteen (14) people. This number is not a statistically significant sample and an attempt was not made to reflect community demographics of age and location breakdowns. However, the opportunity of conducting these in-depth interviews provided corroboration of the themes that were identified in other consultation processes. Many similar themes were identified amongst the advocates and these were also consistent with the themes identified through the community survey.

Each interview lasted at least one (1) hour and involved responding to four key questions

- What do you believe are the main issues affecting the Kiama Municipality at this point in time?
- What are three great things about living in the Kiama Municipality?
- What is your dream for the Kiama Municipality?
- What is your nightmare for the Kiama Municipality?

#### **Key Themes**

Some key themes arising from these interviews were:

#### **Concerns:**

- Stabilising the rate of development and preserving good agricultural land
- Improved public transport system particularly rail
- Adequacy of community service provision particularly for older people
- That services and needs of young people does not get lost when addressing the needs of older people
- Maintain and improve upon Council's relationship and communication with its community

#### **Good Things:**

- The environment (climate, scenery, beaches, rural lands, lifestyle)
- Council cares
- Villages and small townships
- Community spirit

#### Dream for the future:

- Green space maintained
- Increasingly self sufficient as a community in terms of food, waste disposal, power generation
- Slow population and housing growth
- Improved and varied public transport options
- Council remains independent ie not amalgamated
- More community and cultural services

#### Nightmares of the future:

- Loss of agricultural lands
- Increased, fast urbanisation, become a dormitory suburb
- Council amalgamated
- Council dictated to by State Government
- Community services and infrastructure not meeting community needs
