Dear Ms Donnelly

I am writing regarding the Government's decision to remove its Nil Developer Charges Policy for Sydney Water's and Hunter Water's water, wastewater, and stormwater services.

For the purposes of IPART's 2018 *Maximum prices for connecting, or upgrading a connection, to a water supply, sewerage or drainage system, Sydney Water, Hunter Water and Central Coast Council* Final Determination, I hereby notify you that the Nil Developer Charges Policy Change Day is 1 January 2022.

The Government's decision was contingent on a phased reintroduction of charges, which would involve the utilities charging a price below the maximum price calculated under IPART's determination, for a period of time. As you are aware, this will require me to provide Sydney Water and Hunter Water with written approval under section 18(2) of the *Independent Pricing and Regulatory Tribunal Act 1992.* I will write to Sydney Water and Hunter Water separately to provide my approval following the utilities' consultations with developers on future water infrastructure needs.
