The council should like the majority of its citizens learn to live within its means!

As a Singleton resident and rate payer I am very disappointed with the campaign that is being delivered up to support what I believe to be an unnecessary rate increase "special rate variation".

The brochure sent out would make any pyramid seller proud (glossy and full of carefully presented statistics).

The call I received as part of the "Community Consultation" was biased to produce one answer... the key question being "are you willing to accept higher rates or do you want your roads to become unusable" (my interpretation of the question)... there was no other alternative offered!

My belief is that there is a very real third option... to live within our means! Singleton is populated by retirees (fixed incomes), local business people (facing ever increasing threats from external multinationals), farmers (poor prices and regular droughts) and coal miners (wondering for how much longer they will have a job) who are not in a position to just go out and get an increase in income at will. The council like the rest of us should therefore learn to live within its means!

Without looking very hard I see many examples of Singleton council's waste every day;

- Putting totally unnecessary curves in the new section of Wattle ponds road and the section of pioneer road between Wattle Ponds and Bridgeman road. (final price around 4 times the cost of a rural road)
- With the Pioneer road section... the pavement failed just after the road opened and there appears to be no follow-up with the contractor that built it to rectify the problems. (will it be the rate payer that ends up paying for the poor workmanship?)
- Signs warning of driveways that do not exist. (entry to the proposed shopping area near the intersection of Pioneer and Bridgeman roads)
- Replacement of large sections in the walkway that runs parallel to Bridgeman road (do not believe that approach taken was warranted, also a number

of the replaced sections have already cracked)

- Signs to say a footpath stops and another on the far side of a road to stay it starts again and signs to tell you that the footpath runs out (when it is totally obvious)!
- Stone monument to mark rose point park. (it is unnecessary in size, detracts from the sundial and is in no way aesthetically pleasing)
- Giant signs to mark the shire boundary
- Sending out 2 copies of the "For a Better Future" document (1 in letter box drop and another with the rates notice)

The 2.7% of additional rates equates to \$379,000/ annum (no special at \$321,000/ annum vs \$700,000/ annum) there appear to be a number of potential ways to stay with the standard rate rise (broadly in line with inflation, so why is this not enough?) and work within the available funds, potentially some areas of saving that I see are;

- Reduce waste as listed in the examples above.
- Be more modest in the scope associated with the town centre revitalisation. (cost vs benefit)
- Review waste pickup services. (as a 2 person household that recycle and compost in most cases a collection of my waste in a 2 weekly basis would be adequate... however would be useful to have a couple of additional tip vouchers for occasions where additional waste was created)
- 1 senior staff person was a \$270,000 saving, based on any large business that has not conducted a task review within recent years I have no doubt that there are other areas where staff levels could be reduced.
- Given the towns already extensive and underutilised facilities why are we applying for funds for "a multi-purpose exhibition space" (proposals for funds require staff time to produce, building it will only be the first step as then it will then need to be managed and maintained)

My support of a permanent variation of rates of 5% in 2014/2015 in order to commence addressing the infrastructure backlog in relation to roads is conditional upon rapid attention to the completion of sealing of Putty Valley Road. Over a period of 25 years now into the 26th year, Putty Valley Road has received just 2 additional kilometres of bitumen sealing and this was done eleven years ago. Just half of this bitumen sealing has been topped since sealing. The untopped half shows serious degradation of the bitumen surface which patching does not adequately improve. Over this same period of time, the population has progressively increased, along with additional subdivisions and contributions to existing rates. At this time, February 2014, 8 kilometres of the 14 kilometres of Putty Valley have not been sealed. Driving the surface of this unsealed section is a rough ride over a predominantly corrugated surface. These corrugations appear soon after grading due to the heavy traffic and heavy vehicle traffic. Throughout the bushfire season from August to March, there are frequent bushfire emergencies with heavy use of the road Ratepayers of Putty do not receive any services in Putty outside of road grading. Over a period of a quarter of a century. surely Putty Valley ratepayers are overdue for one decent bitumen sealed road. (Box Gap Road was constructed by developers and carries very much lighter traffic to far fewer properties.) 25 years ago, Council declared publicly that the road would be sealed at a rate of a kilometre a year. This didn't happen and now is disregarded because Council has nothing in writing. Therefore, in conclusion, if Council commit in writing, to rapid progression in the bitumen sealing the remaining 8 kilometres of Putty Valley Road, within the next 5 years, then and only then I do support the permanent variation of rates of 5% in 2014/;2015.

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

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

We	are	residents	and	rate	payers	of	Singleton	Council.	

We make the following 2 separate submissions in support of the proposal by Singleton Council to seek a permanent rate variation of rates of 5% to solely fund the maintenance and improvement of local roads in the Singleton LGA.

Submission 1:

We note from Council's January 2014 newsletter how Council would propose to allocate the additional funding raised by this rate variation. We strongly submit that if this rate increase is approved then at least 50% of the additional revenue should be spent on sealing presently unsealed sections of local roads that carry a high level of local traffic. We would include the total length of the Putty Valley Road in this list of priority projects.

We also submit that Council should give serious consideration to taking responsibility (as Council local public roads) of some of the matrix of private rights of way that serve as the local road infrastructure in the in the Howes Valley locality. Council approved the first stage of this subdivision in 1991. But although most of the property's connecting roads were surveyed and constructed at that time to a Council minimum rural unsealed road standard, the roads were not opened as public roads. Contrary to the EPA, Council nonetheless approved the subdivision without ensuring that each new lot in the subdivision had a practicable legal public road access to the Putty Road. This abysmal planning decision of Council has left the owners of the 28 properties in the of having to maintain the interconnecting private roads that give them a singular access to the Putty Road at street address 4320 at a significant personal cost and effort since the early 1990's to the present date, and continuing.

Some of these roads have inevitably deteriorated to an unsound and unsafe condition, putting the landowners concerned and other users of the roads at daily risk of their safety. One of the private roads in question provides the only practicable access to Mount Poppong from the Putty Road. There is a large telecommunications tower on that mountain on which multiple State agencies have installed and need to maintain on a regular basis various transmission and receiving antenna. They include the NSW RFS, NSW Police, State Forests, Emergency Services, National Parks and Wildlife Service, NSW Ambulance and others. None of these State Agencies will accept any responsibility, or contribute any funds or support, to the local property owners for maintaining this vital access road from the Putty Road through the to Mount Poppong. This continuing situation is a catastrophe waiting to happen. Hopefully Singleton Council can step into the breach to provide a sensible lead for these Agencies, who continue to do the emu thing (stick their heads in the sand and pretend that the truck rushing towards them will not hit them).

We understand that Council may never have the funds to seal all of these roads, including the important access road to Mount Poppong. That is not what we ask for. A single grader run over these roads every 2-3 years, with the addition of some road base, would keep them in a minimal trafficable standard that would then allow the affected owners at their own cost and with their own equipment

(mainly hand tools) to maintain them as best they can in the interim periods.

Council's decision in 1991 not to approve the opening of the interconnecting constructed roads through the as local public roads had the inevitable result of relegating the property owners who subsequently purchased their properties in this estate to worse than a third world standard.

Who cuts and clears by hand the large trees that frequently fall across their roads blocking access - they do !(most now in their twilight years with some serious health problems and no chain saw experience). Who reconstructs or repairs washed out bridges and culverts when they become impassable or very very dangerous - they do! Who cleans out road side gutters and constructs roll-overs with only hand tools available in all weather conditions - they do'. Who pays for the little bit of road base or new bridge planking when they can afford it - they do! Who freely give up their time and risk their life as volunteer fire fighters to fight fires in the locality and protect neighbours who are much better off than them- they do!

do not receive any assistance or any tangible benefits in return from Singleton Council. Is 45 kms (and 50 minutes) from Singleton via the Putty road. Is 45 kms cannot therefore make any practicable use of the library facilities, swimming pool or other community facilities that Council provides for residents in the Singleton LGA. The Putty road is a main road. Although Council owns this public road, RMS has the full responsibility and cost of maintaining and improving it. Council also has consistently declined to provide any waste collection services to the Most Council staff and Councillors don't even know that we exist as a small but viable and enthusiastic community within the Singleton LGA who are all devoted to maintaining the ecological diversity and future well-being of our private native forest properties for posterity. In return for making that commitment and the personal sacrifices that it sometimes entails - we receive nothing from Council!

In summary, we support the 5% increase in rates that Singleton Council proposes to seek: provided however that a proportion of the funds generated by this increase is spent by Council in taking over responsibility (as the local public road authority) for the main connecting private access roads in the and and maintaining the unsealed surface of these roads from year to year to a minimal 2WD trafficable rural standard. We are not asking that these roads be sealed. We are only asking that they are generally maintained to a minimal standard and that the NSW Government Agencies that use these roads should also contribute to their maintenance and upkeep.

Submission 2:

We submit that Singleton Council should actively seek to amalgamate with its neighbouring Muswellbrook Council.

Both Council's have a similar rate base, with a strong mining component and a subsidiary agricultural and small business component. Their combined LGA would put them in the very centre, and at the heart, of the Upper Hunter. The economies of scale brought by such an amalgamation would inevitably benefit all residents and ratepayers in the existing LGA's of Singleton and Muswellbrook. We challenge Council to provide any study that would show that an amalgamation of the 2 councils and their LGA's would not be to the financial advantage of all ratepayers in both areas. The continuing conflict between Singleton Council and Muswellbrook Council as to whether the proposed new Hunter Rural Fire Service Control Centre should be established at Bulga (within Singleton LGA) or at some other location within the Muswellbrook LGA only confirms to us the obvious sense in both Councils coming together as one voice and reducing their total costs by the economies of scale that such an amalgamation would achieve.





Hello Mayor & Councillors & General Manager,

I do not agree with a special rate variation predominantly for the maintenance of roads UNLESS the Council sets a standard for ALL roads in the Shire.

We are told that, although the Council sets a "standard" for the construction of roads, the Council permits the construction of "SUB-standard" roads by some developers, and in developments in which the Council is involved.

Although there is much discussion amongst ratepayers and publicity in local print media regarding the deterioration of roads, there is never any explanation from the Council as to whether the roads showing the most deterioration and costing the most to maintain are of SUB-standard construction, or roads constructed to the council's standard.

We have been advised by a private (solicitor) developer that, when the council was insisting that he constructed roads in a new subdivision to the Council's standard, he successfully argued that he should be able to construct roads to the Council's SUB-standard, to which the Council finally agreed.

There is no information in the Community Update regarding the different standards of road construction, and whether developers who are permitted by Council to construct SUB-standard roads to lower their overheads are actually cheating the ratepayers of Singleton Shire in the longer term with respect to increased road maintenance costs AND SUBSEQUENTLY SPECIAL RATE VARIATIONS OF 5%.
