Rosehill Network Pty Ltd's application to vary its WIC Act network operator licence

WHAT

We have received an application from Rosehill Network Pty Ltd (Rosehill Network) to vary its network operator's licence no. 09_002. The variation seeks to:

- extend the scope of the Rosehill
 Network licence to include the existing
 Fairfield advanced water treatment
 plant infrastructure and activities,
 currently authorised under network
 operator's licence no. 09_001
- remove Jemena Limited and Jemena Asset Management Pty Ltd as authorised persons from the licence.



WHY

A varied network operator's licence, if granted, would authorise Rosehill Network, and any nominated authorised persons, to construct, maintain and operate non-potable infrastructure, in the area specified. These activities cannot be undertaken without a network operator's licence.



WHO

Rosehill Network is an existing WIC Act licensee and holds network operator's licence no. 09 002.

More information about Rosehill Network, including its experience, technical and organisational capacity can be found in Schedule A and Schedule C of the application form.



HOW

The Rosehill Recycled Water Scheme (RRWS) is an existing scheme that produces recycled water at the Fairfield AWTP and distributes to industrial customers via the RRWS network.

The Fairfield AWTP receives treated effluent from the Sydney Water owned Liverpool to Ashfield Pipeline and further treats this water through a process consisting of screening, ultrafiltration, reverse osmosis, ion exchange, degassing, and chlorination.

The Fairfield AWTP is currently licensed under Veolia Water Australia Pty Ltd's network operator's licence no. 09_001. The proposed variation will consolidate the assets and activities under one licence.



WHEN

The submissions period is now open and will close on 1 June 2021.



WHERE

The RRWS is located within the Fairfield, Cumberland and Parramatta City Council local government areas. The proposed area of operation for the Fairfield AWTP is identified on the <u>map</u>.
