## **INSTRUMENT UNDER SECTION 508(2)**

### COFFS HARBOUR CITY COUNCIL

The Independent Pricing and Regulatory Tribunal (IPART), delegate of the Minister for Local Government, pursuant to the delegation dated 6 September 2010, determines:

- 1. Under section 508(2) of the Local Government Act 1993 (the Act), that the percentage by which Coffs Harbour City Council may increase its general income for the year 2012/2013 is 5.64%.
- 2. The percentage increase set out in clause 1 above is subject to the following conditions:
  - I. The council uses the Additional Income for the purposes of funding (i) the development of the City Centre Masterplan and (ii) the traffic flow works. The City Centre Masterplan and traffic flow works are listed in Appendix A of IPART's determination dated June 2012 of the council's application under section 508(2) of the Act (IPART's Determination).

Additional Income means:

- a) the additional general income raised in accordance with clause 1 of this instrument, less
- b) the additional general income that would otherwise be available to the council under section 506 of the Act.
- II. The council reports in its annual report for the rating year of 2012/2013 on:
  - a) expenditure on (i) the development of the City Centre Masterplan; and (ii) the traffic flow works listed in Appendix A of IPART's Determination; and
  - b) the outcomes achieved as a result of the special variation.
- III. The council reduces its general income for the 2013/2014 rating year by \$668,900.
