ANNEXURE E

PURPOSE

The purpose of this report is for Council to consider a revised draft hierarchy and associated draft service levels for open space management for the purpose of community consultation. (Please see Annexure E attached to the Business Paper.)

BACKGROUND

Council adopted the current Recreation and Open Space Management Plan in June 2009 following a review process involving the Open Spaces Committee. Whist the plan was developed as a 10 year plan, recent developments in asset management planning has necessitated a further review.

Asset Management Plans (AMPs) were adopted by Council as part of the Integrated Strategic Planning and Reporting Framework in June 2011. Over time the AMPs will be reviewed and updated to reflect improved asset data collection and asset knowledge. This will take Council's AMPs from being "core" to "advanced" documents. Advanced AMPs will provide Council with information and recommendations on asset renewals and maintenance, not just within each asset class, but allowing service level comparisons and decision making across all infrastructure classes within Council's control. These AMPs will also allow Council to start to attach recognised values on the green assets under its control. This will also lead to being able to quantify the link between capital and revenue expenditure and the quality of the green space.

In conjunction with the ongoing review of the AMP's, Council has received a letter from the Division of Local Government that reinforces that the sustainability of Council is intrinsically linked to infrastructure management.

This review of the open space hierarchy has been undertaken to enable development of service levels that are sustainable within Council's current (and predicted) funding regime. Discussions have been held with Council's Open Spaces Committee about the concepts behind the need for a sustainable hierarchy.

During the current financial year, open space maintenance costs have been generated for the full range of maintenance activities undertaken. This has not been done in the past, so it was impossible to develop sustainable service levels. By the end of the financial year, significant data will be available to enable matching of the draft service levels with budgets. The applying of AMP techniques will help to have green assets on a more informed footing with other services when competing for funding.

(a) Relevance to Integrated Planning and Reporting Framework Council is required to develop Asset Management Plans that inform Council's 10 Year Long Term Financial Plan.

(b) Financial Considerations

The recommended open spaces hierarchy is based on Council's (predicted) 10 year financial resources.

COMMENTARY

The proposed hierarchy has been developed in accordance with accepted convention, such as that identified in the NSW Department of Planning Recreation and Open Space Planning Guidelines for Local Government.

The draft open space classification system identifies open spaces by function, catchment and service level.

It separates the open spaces by catchment (hierarchy), being regional, district and local open space.

Regional – serves whole cities or metropolitan subregions, or multiple towns and settlements in non-metropolitan regions. Because of the extent of the catchment regional open space often requires State agency management.

District – serves a number of neighbourhoods and may have a catchment extending beyond the LGA that hosts it.

Local – serves one (1) neighbourhood and is located close to or within residential areas.

The open spaces are also classified by their function:

Type of open space	Description	
Parks	Reserves which have had their physical character and/ or vegetation modified to support community recreation, community development and wellbeing uses. Includes ornamental gardens, play facilities, community gardens and informal lawns.	
Outdoor sports areas	Venues designed to support team sports training and competition.	
Urban public space	Street and road reserves, lanes and town plazas and squares which accommodate walking, cycling, social gatherings or outdoor dining.	
Conservation and heritage	Reserves created to protect and enhance natural and cultural resources.	
Landscape and amenity	Reserves created for their attractiveness and to add to or protect the character of an area. Includes reserves adjoining residential and industrial areas, ridge lines, river flats and sections of road reserves.	

Type of open space	Description
Linear and linkage	Small pathways linking residential streets in urban areas to municipal and regional trails using former rail and water race reserves and dedicated land. Includes creek and river reserves and floodways.
Utilities and services	Land reserved for urban and rural infrastructure and support services.
Undeveloped	Land acquired or zoned for open space purposes to protect its assets or to meet assessed community needs once development of an area proceeds.
Proposed	Land proposed to be zoned or acquired for open space purposes to protect assets or to meet assessed community needs once development of an area proceeds.

Service levels have been separated into Platinum, Gold, Silver and Bronze and are linked to both the hierarchy and function.

There are many parcels of open space that will fall into multiple classifications i.e. Centennial Park and have different levels of service.

Further, it is acknowledged that the service levels provided within Glen Innes and the villages for the same type of open space have varied. The refinement of the classification system aims to ensure that it doesn't matter where the open space is located. That is, if the park is located in Glen Innes or Deepwater and is a local park with a silver level of service, then the maintenance provided will be the same.

Draft mapping has been compiled to reflect the classification system and associated service levels. The Open Spaces Committee has provided input into their development, particularly by undertaking a site inspection of typical areas for mowing services.

At this time, it is recommended that Council seek wider community input into the draft, so that it can ultimately be incorporated into the Asset Management Plan and costings can be finalised for the service levels.

Concurrently with the above, research and community consultation will also be undertaken for the preparation of the recreational needs assessment that is an action in the current Operational Plan.

(a) Governance/Policy Implications

Once adopted, the open space hierarchy and service levels need to be incorporated into the Asset Management Plans (AMP), which form part of Council's suite of Integrated Strategic Planning document.

(b) Legal Implications

From a risk management perspective, adopting a hierarchy and service levels that is sustainable minimises Council's risk exposure and provides a defensible position.

(c) Social Implications

The proposed hierarchy attempts to maximise the common good in directing the bulk of Council's open space expenditure to areas with the most use.

(d) Environmental Implications

The proposed categorisation of open space recognises the built and natural environmental value of open space e.g. cemeteries classified as heritage and conservation

(e) Economic/Asset Management Implications

The 10 year Financial Plan has been based on historical maintenance budgets. Setting service levels is an iterative process to determine a sustainable position. For instance, if budgets are not to be increased above historical figures, but a higher level of service is desired for a particular open space category, then it would be necessary to adjust down the level of service in other open space areas.

CONCLUSION

It is recognised that open spaces are vital to the community for a range of purposes and a valuable green asset. The proposed draft open space hierarchy and classification system attempts to match maintenance service levels to areas that deliver for the common good and cater for multiple uses of open space.

RECOMMENDATION

- 1. That Council endorses the proposed draft open space hierarchy, classification system and maintenance service levels for the purpose of public consultation, attached as Annexure E to the Business Paper.
- 2. That Council requests the Director of Infrastructure Services to prepare a further report to the June 2013 Council meeting detailing community responses and any recommended modifications to the hierarchy, classification system and maintenance service levels and the associated financial implications. And that this be considered in conjunction with the outcomes of the recreational needs assessment.

DRAFT MAINTENANCE RESPONSE LEVELS OF SERVICE

Glen Innes Severn Council prides itself on the condition of its parks. In order to reach community expectations and statutory and risk management requirements a park maintenance regime has been determined. The regime has been determined that meets or exceeds these requirements and expectations yet is sustainable and affordable.

The schedule of maintenance will be based on the classification of the park or reserve. These maintenance schedules will be used to determine the level of funding for open space management.

It must be noted that there are some areas maintained by community committees. These include Dundee Cemetery, Dundee Sportsground, Emmaville Cemetery, Glencoe Cemetery, Glencoe Sportsground, Pinkett Recreation Ground, Red Range Sportsground, Stonehenge Recreation Ground and Wellingrove Cemetery. An approved contractor currently maintains the Church Street Median Gardens and Beardie Woodlot is maintained voluntary by the Glen Innes Correctional Centre.

ANNEXURE K

PURPOSE

The purpose of this report is for Council to approve a revised draft hierarchy and associated draft service levels for open space management, for the purpose of public exhibition.

BACKGROUND

A report was presented to the March 2013 Council meeting presenting a draft Open Spaces Hierarchy for Council's information.

Following that Council Meeting, informal feedback was sought from the Open Spaces Committee as well as both the Deepwater and Emmaville Beautification Committees, and the draft hierarchy is now presented for Council's adoption.

(a) Relevance to Integrated Planning and Reporting Framework

Council is required to develop Asset Management Plans that inform Council's 10 year Long Term Financial Plan.

(b) Financial Considerations

The recommended Open Spaces Hierarchy is based on Council's (predicted) 10 year financial resources.

COMMENTARY

The Hierarchy has been modified to include a very low service level called "Copper", and the following open spaces have been changed from Bronze to Copper:

- Beardy Waters Woodland;
- Dundee Sportsground;
- Pinkett Recreation Ground;
- Red Range Sportsground;
- Glencoe Sportsground;
- Stonehenge Recreation Grounds (except the playground which is silver).

The Wellingrove Fossicking Reserve and council-owned vacant land have also been included in the revision at Copper and Bronze levels respectively.

Deepwater Oval and Emmaville Oval have both been changed to Bronze in the centre and Silver in the surrounds.

Refer to Annexure K for the full description of the hierarchy and service levels for each open space and the changes.

Once adopted, the Open Space Hierarchy and service levels need to be incorporated into the Asset Management Plans (AMP), which form part of Council's suite of Integrated Strategic Planning documents.

(b) Legal Implications
