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Background & Methodology

Richmond Valley council commissioned Micromex Research to conduct a statistically representative telephone survey of residents.

The outputs of this engagement and research approach will provide the Council with a broad based understanding of community attitudes and behaviours towards a range of topics.

Questionnaire

Micromex Research, together with Richmond Valley Council, developed the questionnaire.

A copy of the questionnaire is provided in Appendix B.

Data collection

The survey was conducted during the period 7^{th} to 13^{th} March 2013 from 4:30pm to 8:30pm, Monday to Friday.

Survey area

Richmond Valley Council Local Government Area.

Sample selection and error

Micromex initially contacted 300 residents and asked them to participate in the research program.

A sample size of 300 residents provides a maximum sampling error of approximately +/- 7.5% at 95% confidence.

The sample was weighted by age and gender to reflect the 2011 ABS census data.

This document contains a summary of the answers to all questions in the survey, including percentages and actual counts.

Interviewing

Interviewing was conducted in accordance with IQCA (Interviewer Quality Control Australia) Standards and the Market Research Society Code of Professional Conduct.

Data analysis

The data within this report was analysed using SPSS. To identify the statistically significant differences between the groups of means, 'One-Way Anova Tests' and 'Independent Samples T-Tests' were used. 'Z Tests' were also used to determine statistically significant differences between column proportions.



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Rating questions

The unipolar scale of 1 to 5, where 1 was the lowest agreement/satisfaction/support/effectiveness and 5 the highest agreement/satisfaction/support/effectiveness, was used for all rating questions.

Interpreting the mean scores

Within the report, the mean ratings for each of the criteria have been assigned a determined level of 'support'. This determination is based on the following groupings:

Correlations – definitions

We have run analysis across 3 areas of interest:

- Age
- Gender
- Location/residential area

Word Frequency Tagging

Verbatim responses throughout the report were collated and entered into analytical software. This analysis 'counts' the number of times a particular word or phrase appears and, based on the frequency of that word or phrase, a font size is generated. The larger the font, the more frequently the word or sentiment is mentioned.

Errors: Data in this publication is subject to sampling variability because it is based on information relating to a sample of residents rather than the total number. This difference (sampling error) may occur due to imperfections in reporting and errors made in processing the data. This may occur in any enumeration, whether it is a full count or sample.

Efforts have been made to reduce the non-sampling error by careful design of the questionnaire and detailed checking of completed questionnaires.



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The majority of participants are long-time residents of the LGA.





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Key Outcomes

The outputs of this engagement and research survey address a range of resident behaviours and attitudes towards living in the Richmond valley.

The key outcome of this research is that the community is generally supportive of Council exploring opportunities for the region that will grow the local economy and retain/grow the local population.

Residents were generally strongly supportive of:

- Council developing a master plan for an aviation precinct at and around the Casino aerodrome
- Council owning and developing industrial, commercial and residential land in the local area so as to promote and facilitate progress and expansion
- Council upgrading the Casino Saleyards

2/3 of residents were aware of the new executive management team and nearly 80% indicated that they perceived the new team to be somewhat to very effective in making changes over the last 12 months.







Section A Detailed Findings

Opportunities for participation

Summary

56% of residents feel there are sufficient opportunities for residents of the LGA to participate in artistic and cultural activities.

Male respondents were more likely to agree than were females.

Residents aged 35-64 were less likely to agree than were those aged 65+.

Nearly ³/₄ of residents believe there are enough opportunities to participate in or to attend sporting competitions and/or recreational activities.

Male respondents were more likely to agree than were females.

Residents living in village areas were less likely to agree than were those in a township.

89% of residents feel that there are benefits in living in a diverse community.

Analysis by age, gender and residential location indicate no significant differences in levels of agreement.

55% of residents indicated that they felt they had an opportunity to speak out about key issues affecting the Richmond Valley.

Residents aged 35-64 expressed a higher level of agreement with the statement than did those aged 65+.

Richmond Valley Council Community Strategic Plan March 2013 Whilst overall the vast majority of residents feel safe at home during the day, there are clearly security concerns for many residents.

Male respondents were more likely to indicate a feeling of safety when 'at home alone after dark', 'walking alone in the dark' and 'in the Casino CBD late at night' than were female respondents.

Residents from the rural suburbs were more likely to feel safe 'walking alone in the dark' than were those from a township.

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Personal health

Summary

80% of residents cited their personal health in the range good to excellent.

Whilst still very high, respondents aged 18-49 rated their personal health lower than did those aged 65+.

Last 12 month usage and next 12 month usage levels remain consistent.

The predominant services and facilities used by residents were the 'beach', 'park' and 'library'.

Event attendance

Summary

Residents from 95% of households attended at least one event in the past 12 months. Beef Week (70%) and Primex (68%) were the most attended events.

Female respondents were more likely to have attended the 'St Marks Anglican Church Spring Fair', the 'Quota Art, Craft & Quilt Fair' and the 'Woodburn Orchid Show' than were males.

Residents aged 35-49 were significantly more likely to have attended 'Beef Week' than were residents aged 50-64, but less likely to have visited the 'Woodburn Orchid Show'. Residents aged 18-34 were less likely to have attended the 'Bentley Art Prize' than were those aged 50+.

Residents aged 65+ were more likely to have attended the 'Quota Art, Craft & Quilt Fair' than were those aged 18-34, the 'Casino Garden Show & Flower Fair' and the 'Casino Spring Orchid Show' than were those aged 18-49 and the 'St Marks Anglican Church Spring Fair' than were those aged 18-64.

Residents in towns and rural areas were significantly more likely than village residents to have attended 'Beef Week', the 'Bentley Art Prize', the 'Casino Garden Show & Flower Fair', the 'Casino Show' and 'Primex', but significantly less likely to have attended the 'Woodburn Bridge to Bridge'.

Residents in villages and rural areas were significantly more likely than town residents to have attended the 'Coraki Art Prize' and the 'Woodburn Orchid Show'.

Residents in villages were significantly more likely to have attended the 'Crankfest Xtreme' than were those living in rural areas, but significantly less likely to have attended the 'Casino Spring Orchid Show'.

Residents living in town were significantly more likely to have visited 'St Marks Anglican Church Spring Fair' than were those living in villages, but significantly less likely to have visited 'Carnivale Italiano' than were those living in rural areas.





Event attendance

Residents indicated that the best thing about living in the LGA centres on the location and proximity of the region, as well as the friendly and safe community and peaceful and quiet atmosphere.

Richmond Valley Council Community Strategic Plan March 2013 Satisfaction with the police presence is only just moderate. 71% indicated that they were 'somewhat' to 'very' satisfied with this measure.

Analysis by age, gender and residential location indicate no significant differences in levels of satisfaction.

"Police are courteous and helpful but you feel there should be a greater number of them"

"Extra policing is needed 24 hours a day for residents to feel completely safe"

"Not much crime in the local area and police are around at local events"

"Police are on patrol quite a lot, especially during the holiday period"

"Had no real need for them but have seen them often on the road policing the area"

"They do a great job, are highly visible, and are well known in the area"

"There have been some new additions to the force recently and they are working well with the community"

"Police ceased 24 hour service in Casino and now we need to call Lismore station after hours and it takes too long for the police to arrive"

"Our local area along the Richmond River is unsafe due to lack of police presence, to the point where I do not feel I can answer my door"

"There are not enough police to control the amount of crime in the area"

"There needs to be more of a visual police presence in the area"

"I have had repeated burglaries at my home and the response I received was slow and very unsatisfactory"

"On occasions at my workplace, police have not responded quickly to emergency calls"

"There is a lot of petty theft happening in the area but there are no police around to curtail this"

"A small town such as this should be crime free but there are a lot of break ins and vandalism"



Experience of crime

Summary

12% of residents claim to have been a victim of crime in the last 12 months. The most likely crimes cited were burglary or stealing (59%) or motor vehicle related crime (42%).

Analysis by age, gender and residential location indicate no significant differences in the proportion of residents who have been a victim of crime.

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Residents are supportive of the proposed aviation precinct, with 87% 'somewhat' to 'very' supportive of the potential to grow the aviation offer at Casino Aerodrome.

Analysis by age, gender and residential location indicate no significant differences in levels of support.

Richmond Valley Council is in a rare position, in that it has two air strips that are currently being underutilised. Both air strips play a part within Council's economic development plans, and feature as key physical attributes that can be used advantageously to attract and foster new business to Richmond Valley.

Council is considering developing a master plan for the aviation precinct cluster in and around Casino Aerodrome, which includes:

- (i) Supporting and increasing all relevant activities at the Aerodrome
- (ii) Transforming the Aerodrome so it becomes one of the focal points for Casino, which would be advantageous for the community and for attracting visitors to the local area

89% of residents indicated that they are 'somewhat' to 'very' supportive of Council owning and developing industrial, commercial and residential land in the local area so as to promote and facilitate progress and expansion.

Support was driven by residents indicating that they feel the local community needs to grow if it wishes to prosper/remain viable.

Analysis by age, gender and residential location indicate no significant differences in levels of support.

- Q. Council believes economic development needs to be a central focus if the Richmond Valley region is to prosper and grow. Examples of this would be:
 - The purchase of land to develop the Settlers housing estate in Casino
 - Purchasing suitable land for industrial subdivision purposes.

As part of this, Council will develop and implement planning controls to ensure protection of prime agricultural land and public lands. 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93% of residents indicated that they are 'somewhat' to 'very' supportive of Council upgrading the Casino Saleyards.

This support is driven by the belief that the region needs to play to its historical strengths and invest in job creation/employment for the next generation.

Analysis by age, gender and residential location indicate no significant differences in levels of support.

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2/3 of residents are aware that Council recently appointed a new executive team. 79% indicated that they perceived the new team to be somewhat to very effective in making changes over the last 12 months.
