Re: Cudgegong Valley/ Macquarie Valley Submission to the DLWC Bulk Pricing Proposal 2001-2004.

We wish to support the submissions made by the Macquarie Customer Services Committee and Macquarie River Food and Fibre.

We would also like to add that industry dependant upon irrigation in the Cudgegong Valley is at a very sensitive stage of development and we refer principally to the wine and grapegrowing industry, one that is now larger than the Hunter Valley industry. Cudgegong Valley water users will not be able to afford the water price increases recommended by the DLWC. An example of how inappropriate these increases are is explained below.

The DLWC submission refers to charging irrigators 90% of operating costs of the Windamere Dam, as noted in the Full Cost Recovery section of the submission. Cudgegong Valley irrigators, during the 2000/200 1 season used less than .007% of the storage capacity of the Windamere Dam. It would also be important to identify other beneficiaries before any pricing decisions were made. The Cudgegong irrigation industry is approaching optimum production after **almost** a decade of huge capital infrastructural investment, it is essential to the future of the industry that costs are **contained** at near to or current levels.

We appreciate and support the role of **IPART** in its pricing role and also support the NSWIC in requesting a **freeze** on full cost recovery moves until all the facts are available and a full and proper analysis has been made,
