WHAT

We have received an application for a variation to the licence that authorises the supply of drinking water, non-potable water (recycled water), and sewerage services for **Central Park**.

The variation application seeks to:

- ▼ Expand the area of operations for the Central Park scheme to include the University of Technology (UTS) as a customer.
- ▼ Add end uses for recycled water for water features, general wash-down, street cleaning and process water at the recycled water treatment plant.

We have separately sought stakeholder feedback on the variation application by Central Park Water Pty Ltd (Central Park Water) to vary its network operator's licence (number 12_022) in October 2018 and in early October 2019.



WHERE

The Central Park scheme is located within the City of Sydney local government area. The proposed extended area of operations for the Central Park retail supply scheme is identified on the [map](#).



WHO

Flow Systems Pty Ltd is the holder of the retail supplier's licence (number 13_001R).

HOW

The licence was granted under the *Water Industry Competition Act 2006* (NSW) (WIC Act).

Flow Systems Pty Ltd proposes to supply services to UTS by:

- ▼ Sourcing drinking water from Sydney Water
- ▼ Supplying recycled water from the existing treatment plant
- ▼ Collecting sewage through Central Park Water's sewerage network and discharging the sewage into Sydney Water's sewerage network.

WHEN

The submissions period is now open and will close on 21 November 2019.



WHY

The licence variation, if granted, would authorise Flow Systems Pty Ltd to supply retail services for the expanded Central Park scheme in the areas specified. It would also include additional end uses for recycled water. These activities cannot be undertaken without a licence.
