# **Green Square Water and Flow Systems applications for WIC Act licence variations**



5 November 2019



#### **WHAT**

We have received applications for variations to the licences that authorise the provision of recycled water to residential and commercial customers at the Green Square Town Centre Development Precinct (GSTC).

The variation applications seek to:

- Expand the area of operations to supply recycled water to a total of approximately 4,100 residential customers plus a number of commercial premises and retail outlets.
- Add end uses for recycled water for car washing, general washdown on hard surfaces, dust suppression and process water at the existing recycled water treatment plant.



# **WHERE**

The Green Square scheme is located within The City of Sydney Council local government area. The proposed extended recycled water area of operations is identified on the <u>map</u>.



#### **WHO**

Green Square Water Pty Ltd (GSW) holds the existing network operator's licence (number 15\_031) and is authorised to construct, maintain and operate water industry infrastructure in the GSTC. Flow Systems Pty Ltd (Flow Systems) (parent company of GSW) is the holder of the retail supplier's licence (number 13\_001R) and provides retail services at the GSTC.

#### **HOW**

The licences were granted under the *Water Industry Competition Act 2006* (NSW) (the WIC Act).

GSW seeks to vary its licence to collect stormwater and treat it for supply in the proposed (extended) area of operations. Under the existing licence, GSW already treats stormwater to supply homes and businesses in the GSTC, as a non-potable water supply. GSW proposes to extend the existing non-potable water infrastructure to connect the treatment plant at the GSTC to the Gunyama Park and Aquatic Recreation Centre.

Flow Systems seeks to vary its licence to extend its area of operations to include areas within GSW's network operator's licence variation.

Both licence variations seek to add end uses to be authorised by the existing licences.



## **WHEN**

The submissions period is now open and will close on 3 December 2019.



# **WHY**

The licences, if varied, would authorise GSW, Flow Systems and the City of Sydney Council (as nominated authorised persons), to construct, maintain and operate non-potable water industry infrastructure and to supply retail services in the area specified. These activities cannot be undertaken without a licence.
