IPART is reviewing the framework for sharing the efficient costs of rural bulk water services (WaterNSW's rural services) and water management services (WAMC's services) between water customers and the NSW Government.



During the 2016-17 review of WaterNSW's rural prices, we committed to reviewing the current cost share framework.



During this review we will engage with a range of stakeholders, including:

- customers of WaterNSW and WAMC, and their representative bodies
- the NSW Department of Industry and the Natural Resources Access Regulator
- WaterNSW, and
- other interested stakeholders.



The Issues Paper sets out the following:

- our cost sharing principles and objectives
- an overview of our plan to review the current activity-based approach, and

 an outline of our proposal to move to a service-based approach, if the benefits are likely to exceed the costs.
