



NSW retailers can choose whether or not to offer solar feed-in tariffs



To help guide retailers and customers, IPART annually recommends a benchmark range for these tariffs based on the financial value of solar electricity



Most retailers are currently offering **6-17c/kwh** for feed-in tariffs

If you have solar panels, you avoid buying some electricity from your retailer. This is likely to be a bigger financial benefit than the credit you receive from your feed-in tariff.

Therefore, the highest feed-in tariff may not be the best overall deal.

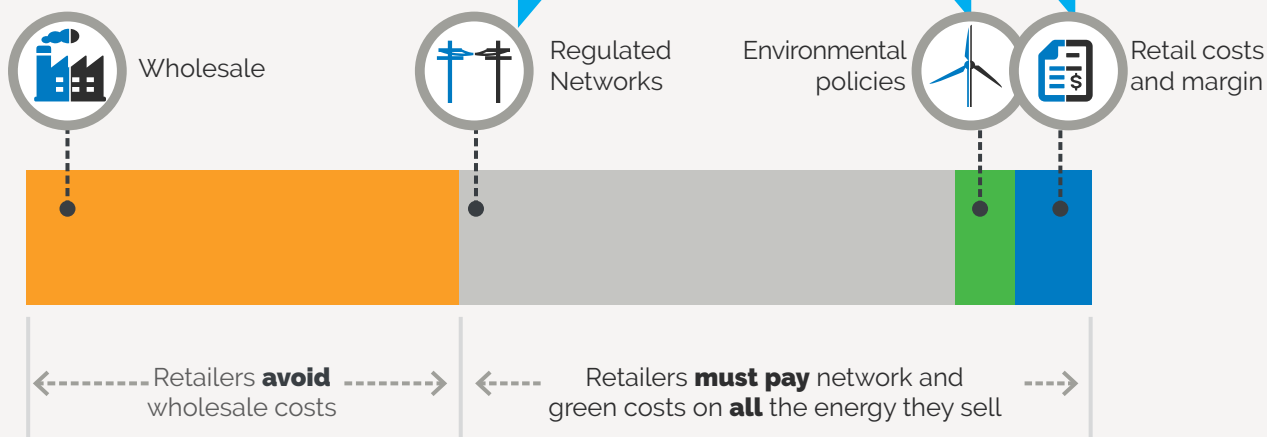
Feed-in tariffs typically vary with wholesale electricity prices

Customers should go to energymadeeasy.gov.au to compare energy plans



Feed-in tariffs are **less** than the price of buying electricity from your retailer (around 30 c/kwh)

Why? When retailers sell energy that has been exported to the grid from solar panels, they **only save** on the costs of buying energy. They **still incur the costs** of the network (poles and wires), green costs and retailing
