
- councils planning to apply for an SV in 2021-22 or in future years

WHAT NEXT

Councils intending to apply for an SV for 2021-22 should:

- ▼ review IPART's Information Paper, Special Variations in 2021-22
- contact IPART as soon as possible to discuss their SV proposal
- refer to the SV Application Form and Application Guide and Information Paper Community engagement and awareness for SVs, which are available on IPART's website
- ▼ notify IPART that they intend to apply for an SV by 27 November 2020
- ▼ submit an application by 8 February 2021.



Ratepayers of councils proposing an SV for 2021-22 should:

- expect their councils to be consulting with them and seeking their feedback on proposed rate increases
- ▼ note IPART will conduct a submission process after councils submit their applications in February 2021.
