WUA MidCo Pty Ltd applications for WIC Act licences

WHAT

WUA MidCo Pty Ltd (WUA) has applied for a network operator's licence and a retail supplier's licence, under the *Water Industry Competition Act 2006* (NSW) (the WIC Act).

The applications are for the existing Kooragang Industrial Water Scheme (KIWS) which provides recycled water to Orica, an industrial customer at Kooragang Island, in the Newcastle local government area.

IPART is seeking comments from stakeholders as part of our assessment of WUA's applications.



WHERE

The proposed area of operations is in the Newcastle local government area and is identified on the attached map.



WHO

HOW

The applications are for the existing KIWS which provides recycled water to Orica, an industrial customer.

Treated effluent is sourced from the Shortland Wastewater Treatment Works

operated by Hunter Water, for the production of recycled water at the Advanced Water Treatment Plant in Mayfield West.

The scheme is limited to the existing water industry infrastructure and we understand that it does not require further development consent.

If granted, the network operator's licence would authorise WUA to operate and maintain the water industry infrastructure. The retail supplier's licence would authorise WUA to provide retail services for drinking water and recycled water to Orica. WUA have contracted Suez Water Pty Ltd, who holds an existing network operator's licence and a retail supplier's licence, to undertake the services.



WHEN

The submissions period is now open and will close on 30 January 2019.



WHY

A network operator's licence, if granted, would authorise WUA, and any nominated authorised persons, to construct, maintain and operate water industry infrastructure, in the area specified.

A retail supplier's licence, if granted, would authorise WUA to provide retail services for the KIWS in the area specified.

These activities cannot be undertaken without a network operator's licence and a retail supplier's licence.


