Updating regulated electricity prices for 1 July 2014

17 February 2014

IPART regulates the electricity prices that EnergyAustralia and Origin Energy charge to households and small businesses who have not entered into a market contract. These customers represent less than half the small customers in NSW.

In June 2013 we released our determination on regulated prices from 1 July 2013 to 30 June 2016. We undertook to update these prices in 2014 and 2015 to account for changes in the electricity market.

We have commenced our annual review for price changes to come into effect on 1 July 2014. This fact sheet outlines our process for undertaking this review and explains how stakeholders can be involved.

What is the process and timetable for the review?

In our June 2013 report, IPART predicted an indicative price change of 1.8% in 2014/15, which is below the rate of inflation.

Since we made these estimates, there have been some changes which we will incorporate in our 2014 annual review. For example, we estimated that network prices would increase by the rate of inflation in 2014/15. However, recent proposals by the network businesses in NSW indicate that network prices will change by less than inflation.¹ We will ensure that network prices approved by the AER are incorporated into regulated retail prices.

We invited EnergyAustralia and Origin Energy to submit proposed changes to their 2014 regulated prices by January 2014. At this stage we have not received any proposals. As this is an update our analysis will focus on only certain cost elements, including wholesale electricity, green scheme costs, energy losses and customer acquisition and retention costs. Our regulatory framework will also allow for the carbon price to be removed from regulated prices should the legislation be repealed by the Federal Government.

We will release our draft report in April and our final report in June 2014. Table 1 provides an indicative timetable for the review.
