In response to the Interim Report I submit the following comments,

Whilst it may be difficult to estimate the ongoing cost to the community of injury/deaths from poles I would consider these to be significant. The report appears to ignore the benefit to the community of less trees being cut down and the beneficial impact on the environment. I consider this to be a major benefit to the community. I believe it is unrealistic to expect ratepayers to pay 80% of up to \$5,000 in costs. This ignores the obovementioned benefits. My street has part underground and part above ground - are you proposing to charge those who already have underground. I do not believe that my property is valued at \$5,000 less than properties in my street that have underground power/communications. If the levy is on ratepayers will landlords be given a legally enforceable right to recover this cost from their tenant - I doubt it. Whilst I would like to have the poles removed I am not prepared to pay this level of cost. It should be borne by the Government/suppliers of electricity/communications. I do not believe the community at large is aware of the financial impact of the proposals contained in the Report and would be unwilling to pay in the manner proposed.
