# **Updates to the WIC Act Audit Services Panel**

The Independent Pricing and Regulatory Tribunal of NSW (IPART) is proposing to simplify the structure of the *Technical Services and Audit Panel* and update and streamline application forms.

The panel supports the audit framework under the *Water Industry Competition Act* (NSW) 2006 (WIC Act). IPART keeps a list of approved auditors to ensure all WIC Act licensees have access to appropriate auditors. Licensees can also nominate auditors and request their approval by IPART. IPART's preferred approach is for pre-approved auditors to be used to conduct all audits.

#### **WIC Act Audit Services Panel**

The updated WIC Act Audit Services Panel (Panel) requirements:

- No longer include a list of technical service providers. Our requirements have changed, and we now procure technical advice services via the NSW Government <u>professional services scheme</u>.
- Allow operational audits of network operator licensee's compliance to be conducted by any auditor on the Panel. Auditors can also apply to be included as specialist auditors in four additional categories for licence plans and new infrastructure audits.
- Remove the separate auditor category for sustainability assessments, and instead, licensees are instructed to use the appropriate specialist licence plans auditor.
- Remove the environmental management category as it was not being used by our licensees.
- Now allow operational audits of retail supply licensee's compliance to be conducted by any auditor on the Panel, and eliminated the retail category.
- Revise our selection criteria and minimum requirements to be listed on the Panel.
- Provide a two part application process:
  - Application for WIC Act Audit Services Panel Form A Organisations
  - Application for WIC Act Audit Services Panel Form B Auditor.<sup>1</sup>
- Are described in the updated WIC Act Audit Services Panel Application Guide to help applicants to prepare applications.
- Provide for applicants to sign and submit applications electronically.

Current Panel members (with up-to-date Panel agreements) will not need to apply to become members of the updated Panel. They will be provided with the updated Panel agreement for signing in due course.

### **Auditor criteria and requirements**

Auditors do not need to be registered with or certified by a professional body as auditors, but need to have completed the appropriate training. This includes both auditor and lead auditor classifications. A lead auditor should have acquired additional audit experience to develop the knowledge and skills to lead audit teams.

Exemplar Global (formerly RABQSA<sup>2</sup>) has recently revised its auditor certifications and changed the auditor grade structure.<sup>3</sup>

#### **IPART** requires auditors to demonstrate:

- At least 5 years' experience in the water industry, either employed directly in the water industry or as a consultant to the water industry.
- A degree or diploma recognised in Australia in a field that contributes to the development of knowledge and skills for auditing in the water industry.
- Auditor knowledge and skills relevant to the water industry. This may be demonstrated using a combination of the following:
  - Recognised generic auditor training evidenced, or auditor observed to be competent by a certified skill examiner or person with the appropriate competencies to assess. This would be evidenced by a Certificate of achievement, or Certificate IV Workplace Training and Assessment, Exemplar Global SE assessment, or similar.
  - At least 5 audits or 100 hours of audit experience in the last 5 years in the water industry, as an auditor or acquired under the supervision of an auditor documented in an audit log.
  - Experience in a water industry technical or professional position involving exercise of judgement, decision-making, establishing or reviewing risk management systems and problem solving.
- Lead Auditor knowledge and skills can be demonstrated using a combination of the following:
  - Recognised generic lead auditor training. Evidenced by a certificate of achievement and audit log showing at least 2 audits conducted in the last 5 years.
  - Knowledge and skill to lead audit teams acquired by working under the direction and guidance of a different audit team leader.

### Speciality auditor criteria and requirements

In addition to operational audits, auditors can apply to be included in four additional audit categories:

- Infrastructure performance
- Drinking water quality
- Recycled water quality
- Sewage management.

The basic requirements for auditors apply to all specialist auditors and additional criteria must be met.

For the drinking water quality and recycled water quality specialty auditor categories only, NSW Health is involved in assessing and approving auditors.

## The key changes to selection criteria for auditors are:
