SOLAR FEED-IN TARIFFS 2017/18

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In view of the fact that the NSW government saw fit to pay people \$0.60/Kwh for solar, it seems very unjust for our regulators to now allow power companies to take excess solar from small scale generators and not compel them to pay at least wholesale prices at time of use.
