I support a fair price for solar;

I beleive it should increase in line with the wholesale price of electricity because electricity companies are charging that electricity out at higher rates in all periods of the week i.e. peak and off-peak.Because retailers are earning so much money in all periods as opposed to the amount they would pay in the proposed range of 11.6-14.6c. I actually believe it should be at the higher end of this or a minimum of 5c less than the lowest price the electricity company charges in the off-peak period. This way they would make 5c on the off peak and cover costs and gain full profit for the electricity generated over and above the minimum in the peak or other periods.
