

SUBMISSION TO IPART REVIEW
SOLAR FEED-IN TARIFFS 2017/18

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I believe that a reasonable feed in tariff for solar would be around 22 cents per KWH. This would more fairly represent:

- 1, The capital cost of solar equipment. It would also encourage more people to invest in solar.
 - 2, The environmental and health benefits of solar. Cleaner air as a result of less burning of coal and fewer respiratory illnesses as a result
 3. The reduction in need for the construction of large power stations as rooftop solar provides power to the grid.
 4. Solar represents environmental sustainability in energy production.
