To the Independent Pricing and Regulatory Tribunal (IPART). A double the NSW feed-in tariff benchmark from 5.5-7.2c/kWh to 11.6-14.6c/kWh would be a far better representation of the true value of solar to the electricity supply . In making such a recommendation the feed-in tariff also be a regulated requirement on electricity retailers not something left to retailers to decide. When building our house I put solar panels on the roof not simply to feed into the grid but because I wanted my footprint to be reduced and because I am aware of the benefits to the environment and to people's health if more electricity is produced by renewable means. I fully support a pricing system that can become a permanent and regulated method of offering a fair feed-in tariff in line with the wholesale electricity price.
