## Submission to draft report on estimating equity beta for the WACC

PIAC supports the intent of IPART's draft decision in maintaining the stability, certainty, replicability and predictability of its Weighted Average Cost of Capital (WACC) method, as well as ensuring it produces reasonably accurate estimate.

The determination of WACC has a significant impact on the prices for essential water services and the long-term financial incentives regulated businesses face. This highlights the importance of establishing and using a transparent and defensible methodology. PIAC looks forward to IPART finalising its WACC methodology for use in coming price determinations and commencing the next scheduled review of the full WACC methodology at a future date.
