Subject: Review of prices for water, sewerage and stormwater services for Gosford City Council and Wyong Shire Council June 2012.

I am writing to oppose the proposed increase that Wyong Council is seeking for the water, sewerage and stormwater services.

Council should not expect to be able to bleed ratepayers dry in a short period when these essential services under their control need to be planned for a long term future. Any proposed upgrade should have been identified and planned long before an urgent necessity so increases like these should not be put upon current ratepayers to provide a fix for another generation which we all want to see live in a healthy and affordable environment.

Ratepayers can understand a minor increase and they themselves must budget for the future and the council too must be responsible for their actions.
