Submission: My husband and I are not interested in making money out of the feed-in tariff. However we wish it to be fair to the owners as well as the providers. We have a large family of six adults who all still reside in our family home and my husband and I made a decision a couple of years ago to reduce our footprint on our world by reducing our carbon emissions and also to save our family some dollars on our electricity bill. Unfortunately we were just outside the cutoff for a fair price for our feed in tariff and currently receive five cents/kw for what we transport to the grid. We discuss this regularly within our family and friends and believe a fair deal would be kilowatt for kilowatt, ie the power I produce is the same as yours so, if I transport say one hundred kilowatts onto the grid in a quarterly cycle then the provider may deduct the cost of one hundred kilowatts or the monetary value of that from my bill. However we realise that the upkeep of infrastructure is expensive so we would be happy to contribute to this so, another scenario may be that we request say twenty cents/kw for electricity transported to the grid by owners. I believe these submissions to be fair to both parties. At the moment we are down twenty cents /kw on what we buy back from providers and that isn't fair or equitable at all.
