Dear members of the IPART and whom it may concern,

I am writing this letter of **objection** and **great concern** to the application for a licence to operate a sewage/water recycling utility at 617 Freemans Drive Cooranbong N.S.W.

As you consider this matter please take into consideration, the run off rain water properties get and will get from this facility. I live at [REDACTED] my property shares the boundary with 617. My property has a slope down and across of about 15 degrees, which even in a small rain event we receive run off.

Cooranbong has high percentage of rain fall each year resulting in run off down through the property to the house including neighbouring houses, it then runs into a small creek which in turn flows into a pond which is surrounded by houses.

We here at Cooranbong and surrounding areas have just experienced high rain fall and electricity black outs for 3-4 days. How will this complex deal with no power and overflow, as the ground still after a week is still sodden and run off is still occurring.

My issue is not with the facility itself it is the position of it. Why build a complex such as this in the middle of an existing town where it will be of no use. At previous meetings, when asked why it could not be built at the end of the north Cooranbong subdivision away from ANY HOMES I was not given any reasonable answer, this is not a case of not in my backyard I think it should be built away from any homes where it has the potential to impact those living near it in a negative way.
