Submission: The proposal that self-funded retirees should pay as much as \$9 per day to use public transport (up from \$2.50) is extraordinary and counter-productive. Once a week I volunteer at the Australian Museum, traveling during peak periods. For my efforts it is being proposed that I pay up to \$300 per annum extra, not much of an encouragement for me to continue in this role. Additionally my wife and I use public transport to attend events in the city. Once there we spend money at restaurants, the theatre and other shops. Increasing our travel costs by as much as \$13 per occasion will act as a significant disincentive to undertake such activities so regularly. Increasing fares for self-funded retirees by more than 300% defies logic and may have unintended impacts on how citizens in this category spend their time and money.
