In fact fares should be reduced for passengers who for the past 13 years have had to tolerate the worst run rail system in Australia and for that matter many other countries. I live in the North Western area of Sydney in the lower mountains and travel by train on the Richmond Line, which has not seen an upgrade since the line was electrified in the early 1990's, this together with the fact there is only a single track from Quakers Hill causes many disruptions to an already poor service. To suggest that people who use this line and travel from the Richmond/Windsor area will be required to pay more that \$50 for weekly ticket will see many people using their cars to travel to and from their place of employment.
