Review of rural and regional bus fares

WHAT

IPART has been asked to determine the maximum fares for rural and regional bus services from 1 January 2018, and provide advice to the NSW Government on the development of on-demand services in rural and regional areas of NSW.

We released an <u>Issues Paper</u> in May identifying the key issues, and received stakeholder submissions.



WHY

IPART's current fare determination for rural and regional buses is due to expire on 31 December 2017



WHERE

This review covers all areas of NSW **except** the Sydney metropolitan and outer areas (Newcastle, Wollongong, part of the Hunter region and Blue Mountains).



WHO

This review affects people who may use bus services provided by private operators under contracts with the NSW Government, and Community Transport Service Providers in rural and regional areas.



HOW

We will undertake public consultation, do our own research and analysis, and obtain expert advice in setting maximum fares from 1 January 2018. We are conducting operator and customer surveys, and appointed AECOM to investigate and provide advice on the efficient costs of providing rural and regional bus services in NSW.



WHAT NEXT

Once we have undertaken our analysis and considered the advice and submissions we receive, we will release a Draft Report in September 2017 that explains our draft determination, findings and recommendations, and seek further submissions.

We will consider all submissions and comments on the Draft Report before making our final determinations and recommendations, and provide our Final Report to the Minister for Transport and Infrastructure in December 2017.
